1. Co-Chair Reports

Councillor Baillie reported that he attended the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) Convention. There was not a lot of discussion regarding seniors. He noted Homelessness Awareness Week and Fire Prevention Week. He commented on the Surrey Food Bank's special "seniors" times and stated that socialization is a big part of their services.

S. Baker stated that food security relates to seniors as well as families.

1. Review Work Program

S. Baker commented on the lack of low-income rental units for seniors in the Township, and the need for the committee to continue to make this a priority topic to provide Council with meaningful and productive recommendations. Discussion ensued and the committee felt this topic should be included in the 2025 Work Plan with a recommendation going to Council early in the new year. Staff commented that the committee could have the opportunity to provide input at a high policy level.

K. Ludlam noted that the City of Toronto has created a corporation that focuses on seniors housing. This corporation provides housing and other supports that seniors need, including social, medical, mental health, transportation, etc.

Action: Staff to provide information regarding the Toronto Seniors' Housing Corporation to committee.
